Disinfecting Morbern Coated Fabrics

General disinfection

Bleach

Dilute the bleach up to a 9:1 ratio (10%). Liberally apply diluted bleach solution using a sponge. Rinse with cold water several times. Wipe dry. Be sure to follow the guidelines on the bleach label.

Isopropyl Alcohol

Isopropyl Alcohol with concentration of around 70% can kill coronaviruses. Leave the 70% Isopropyl Alcohol solution for one minute. Follow this with several clean water rinses before wiping dry.

Hydrogen Peroxide

Hydrogen Peroxide with a 3% concentration can be applied. Hydrogen Peroxide with a 3% concentration can be applied to the product and allowed to sit for one minute. Follow this with several clean water rinses before wiping dry.
